A field trip to the Parrish Art Museum will take place next week to view the student art exhibition.

In music, the children have been listening and dancing to music related to the upcoming St. Patrick's Day holiday. In physical education class, Ms. Kristin Davey, from Peaceful Planet Yoga, is working on team building activities with our students. Ms. Kiang, our Technology Teacher, continues to work with the children's robotic Lego kits and teaching them how to program simple machines that will be able to draw. Our students are also learning to string 3-word phrases in Spanish language class, with Mrs. Velasquez.

The Board discussed the enrollment for the upcoming school year. School tours and screenings are underway for interested families that reside in and out of district for the 2023-2024 school year. Mr. Finello and Mrs. Krempler met with representatives at both the Hampton Library in Bridgehampton and John Jermain Library in Sag Harbor to discuss the open enrollment possibilities for children entering preschool through 3rd grade.
