climate. In math, they are counting, identifying colors, shapes and sorting objects by attributes. In ELA, the kindergarteners have begun Unit 6. They are focusing on decoding and encoding consonant blend. They also began their first unit reader, Kit. In math, students are continuing to work on understanding addition and subtraction equations. All of our students are learning about how animals stay warm in climates such as Antarctica. They completed a Groundhogs Day writing activity and will begin a Valentine writing activity this week. Our 3rd grade group are reading their unit reader, Sir Gus. Students are completing a unit on rounding numbers to the nearest 10 and 100 with numbers up to 1000. They also will begin preparing for the NYS English Language Arts and Math Assessments. Teresa Schwartz, a parent of a pre-k student and 2nd grader, hosted a celebration about Lunar New Year on Jan. 28th. This week, Karen Clement and Juan Zeledon, parents of a 3rd grader, are joining us for a Valentine Day activity. In music, the children have been learning about different types of drums. They have learned the history of each drum and the different sound that each drum makes. In Technology, Mrs. Kiang, has been working hard to complete a digital alphabet book with each class. Students chose a letter, decorated the letter and made a video recording of the letter and an object that begins with that letter. In art, all students are busy creating masterpieces that will be displayed at the Parrish Art Museum art show. Lastly, Ms. Velasquez, has been teaching the students 4 Spanish songs that they enjoy chanting. They are also working on weather, climate and Valentine vocabulary.
